- 2022 Budget vs Actual
 - o \$38,000 over budget for income
 - \$64,000 under budget for expenses
 - Applied same logic for 2023 budget planning
 - 2023 budget emphasized items that were rated as important in member survey, such as fire prevention
- Delinquencies policy needs legal review, Chris will follow up and copy the board.

 - · Community Wildfire Protection Plan (CWPP) for Lexington Basin Meeting has been rescheduled for February 22, 2023, from 5:30 to 7:30 pm. held at the Redwood Estates Pavilion.

Roads / Projects:

- Damage to roads is being evaluated by Geo-Technical Consultants to determine repairs.
- Storm clean-up as required.

Drainage:

- Cleaning culverts as required.
- Please clear road edges and drainages of leaves and tree debris that can be washed into drainages and cause flooding

Storm Damage

- State of California has declared a state of emergency for the Jan 2023 storms, but
 Santa Clara County has not so it's currently not clear if RESA is eligible
- Drainage improvements/culvert
 - Will assess areas of concern and determine what is needed
 - Possibility enlist seasonal pool employees to clean out as part of their employment
- Jeff has contacted Associated Terra Consultants, Inc. for proposal for road repairs plan. (Referred by SJWC)
 - \$10,500 for an engineering plan, then will get quoted on the work.
 - Potential issue: Many contractors won't work for private community because a term of lawsuit for lawsuits against contractors
 - Will obtain 3 quotes before deciding how to proceed moving ahead
- Resident should report culvert issues to the office to look into it
 - If culvert is on private property, might no be able to resolve without agreement of owner
 - o Jeff to provide list of culverts most in need of service for BoD review
 - Also, culvert maintenance ideas, things for residents to look out for (Youtube videos)
- RESA is not responsible for tree trimming on private property
 - Will publish list of vendors from MNN
 - Thanks from BoD and members to Jeff for being out during the storm responding to residents and driving cleaning up so much, and Cheryl for coordinated
- Alma Ct. Highway 17 culvert dumps water unto Alma Ct. resident heard that CalTrans would improve, but burden to push through falls on the residents affected, as CalTrans will not recognize RESA in those matters.
- SJWC contacted Jeff to discuss plans for closing roads for water main construction and new hydrants. Not on Friday (trash day). Will impact many residents through the main throughfare. Need to notify residents at least 30 days, but we will notify as soon as possible. Currently still bidding, no timeline yet, but will inform
- Pavilion parking lot will be torn in Spring up for underground electric for fire station construction, some residents will have access limitations. County will repave when the work is complete

New Business and Public Comment

RESA continuation of business plan / emergency operations

- Bylaws require us to have a plan for the continuation of normal RESA business in anticipation of an emergency <quote section>
- Not an emergency services or response plan
- American Red Cross Shelter they would need to survey then get an agreement in place to activate as a shelter
- Not increasing scope of responsibility in an emergency continuation of normal scope of operation
 - Need to also define what our normal clear scope of responsibility as part of this
- Joe Bruna will take the first steps on drafting the plan and circulating to BoD

Research grants and funding for disaster recovery and preparedness

- o See discussion above in Presidents report
- FEMA Federal Disaster Declaration Fact Sheet, indicates we may be eligible for some programs even if Santa Clara County has not declared a emergency.
 - Cheryl to continue to investigating FEMA, state and county assistance
 - Joe will assist

ID cards for BoD and employees

- Some kind of official ID to be used in emergency to gain access to RESA to handle emergency
 - No real authority, but if expensive it could help

Old Business

• Cell Tower

- o RESA owns the land the tower is on, and lease to a company that has erected a tower they lease to AT&T
 - \$3800/month currently
- o Approached repeatedly to buy out lease in perpetuity after 20 years
- o BoD has felt the deal had hidden clauses that may harm RESA
 - Before engaging with offers, need a policy in place for how community is notified of spending over a certain amount to avoid mishandling.

• Pavilion repairs needed

- o Leak by front door from the storms, hallway floor by bathrooms damaged
 - Needs to look good for event rentals
